Papers should be based on primary and secondary sources and provide innovative perspectives on the theme. If selected, the author will be given the opportunity to present his/her paper at the Conference.

Proposals should be include the title of the paper and an abstract of the proposed paper of no more than 200 words. Include a biography of the author of no more than 100 words written in the third person.

Possible approaches to the theme (Others encouraged):

Crisis is defined as a time of intense trouble and danger requiring difficult decisions and often resulting in significant change to an individual, institution, or society. Throughout history, it is often these decisive moments that shift the course of human history. Crisis creates opportunities for people to come together and develop solutions. Sometimes humans have seen the coming crisis and other times have been blind-sided. Papers should examine and develop arguments about the causes, methods of handling, or results of and responses to a crisis or crises in history rather than simply describing a crisis. Papers may consider social, political, economic, environmental, religious, artistic, intellectual, or technological crises.

Andrew Jackson: Founder of the Democratic Party

Proposal: President Andrew Jackson crafted the modern political framework for both of the current major parties in the United States in his founding of the Democratic Party through his denial and support of states' rights as seen in his dealing with the Nullification Crisis and the veto of the re-chartering of the Second National Bank. In the 1820-1830s, Andrew Jackson rose as the preeminent leader of the new Democratic Party emerging from the Jeffersonian Republicans. Jackson ushered in the Era of the Common Man and brought about radical changes in American politics. Through examination of his personal writings, including letters and official documents, especially vetoes, Jackson should be seen as a revolutionary leader and the founder of the new political philosophies of the second party system of the United States and a focus on the "common man."
